

Yellowstone Winter Checklist

Clothing

- Prepare for extreme cold weather, but wear layers in case of warmer temps
 - Warm **hat** (make sure it covers your ears)
 - Gloves** (personal preference of mittens/gloves, open fingers or closed)
 - Pants** (snow pants if you want to sit in the snow)
 - Warm wool **socks**
 - Insulated, waterproof **boots**
 - Base layers** (top and bottom, wool or synthetic)
 - Insulated jacket** (down or synthetic)
 - Waterproof shell jacket** (or a 3-in-1 jacket that has two jackets together)
 - Face mask** (definitely needed if it's below zero)

Camera gear

- I'd recommend a **lenscoat** to insulate your hands from the COLD lens barrel.
- A **backpack** to put your camera/lens in for the snowcoach (keep the lens cool)
- An absorbent **towel** in case your lens hits the snow
- Lenses** (at least one wide-medium zoom and one telephoto)

Extras

- Hand warmers**
- Blanket** (the snowcoach should have some)
- Lunch** (provided with snowcoach)
- snacks** and **drinks** (hot chocolate may be available at Madison Junction)
